Dear Friends,

I am always intrigued by what makes the headlines in the newspapers. Most days, courtesy of the BBC news website, I look at the headlines in the national papers to see what they consider to be important.

So, on the day of writing there is much about Donald Trump's desire to take over Greenland, the apparent breakdown in relations in the Beckham family, questions over the Chagos Islands, along with too much attention on the sunglasses worn by President Macron of France.

The editors need to try to work out what will sell papers, not how best to reflect the news. The sad thing is that the more willing to have a pop at political figures - at home or abroad - celebrities who are misbehaving, or failings of local authorities, utility providers, and the like, the better they sell. Rarely did the editors side with good news, so in recent times the good news seems to revolve around the success of women's sports teams, with English victories in the football and rugby.

The saddest thing about this is that it would seem that bad news sells. If a government, of whatever colour, attained great success, one wonders whether it would hit the headlines or be tucked away somewhere in the midst of the newspaper with minimal headlining and little commentary.

This to me seems to contrast with life, where we tend to focus more on the good, to celebrate, rather than allowing what is bad to dominate. We are more inclined to share our good news than the newspapers seem to be.

I conducted a funeral today and it was, as funerals often can be, a love story. The lady who died was well into her 90s, originally from Jamaica, but had made her home in Aylesbury since 1964. Jamaica at the time was facing tremendous economic

hardships, so firstly her husband, and then she, made their way to the UK in search for better life for themselves and for their six children. The agonising part of the story is that they had to leave the children in Jamaica with their grandmother. It took them four years of scrimping and saving, of foregoing anything exciting, before the whole family were reunited in 1968.

I confess I am humbled just thinking about this, of a willingness to leave the children behind in search of something that would ensure their future. It must have been so hard but it was an act of tremendous love. The son, who delivered the eulogy, had tears in his eyes as he remembered the final two children arriving in 1968 and the family being together again.

He then went on to talk about how his mother spent the rest of her life doing what she could to show the depth of love that she had for her brood and their descendants. Her story of sacrifice and pain out of love should have made the headlines. but it never did. The emotion of her children and grandchildren was palpable as they remembered the family matriarch.

The family have stories to share with future descendants. I suppose this invites us to reflect on those who, out of love for us, have sacrificed, who have made life harder for themselves because of the love they have for those who are important in their sight.

It is a story of parents, especially mothers, going without so children have enough to eat, of grandparents moving far from where they call home to support their family in need. There are so many stories of love that we would do well to notice and respond to. This might, hopefully, help us to recognise the heart of Jesus story - there is love in all its beauty.

May the blessings of love be in all our lives,



Weedon Methodist Chapel's stained glass

This article was written by **Andrew Barber**, a member of Heaton Moor United Church, in Stockport, Greater Manchester which has its own W J Pearce window.

Walter John Pearce (the artist behind the glass) was born in Brighton in 1857. Sadly, he was orphaned at the age of 10. Being an orphan in Victorian England was not easy start in life to say the least! He was moved between at least two orphanages but at the age of 14 he was apprenticed to a Painter & Decorator in Chard in Somerset, a placement that was to dictate the direction of his life.



Ten years later we find him living in Lewisham, London, working for Cox & Sons. The firm specialised in furnishing and decorating churches and had its own glass works. It is clear that Walter learned his skills in glass painting and producing leaded windows here.

In 1883 Walter married Annie Hood in Lewisham and within seven years they had moved to Didsbury, Manchester and built a family of three children. One child was adopted, and we can only speculate that Walter, having been an orphan himself, wanted to give a child a better start in life.

By the mid-1890s Walter had his own firm creating stained-glass windows, working from a workshop in Gartside St. in the centre of Manchester. Here he worked with other artists and craftsmen to produce leaded windows. It is likely that the workshop was one of many that fed the fashion for leaded panels in front doors and opening lights in the houses of the rapidly growing city, but it is Walter's designs for church windows that live on as his main legacy.

Beyond glass painting and manufacturing windows, Walter also taught painting and decorating at Manchester Municipal School of Technology

and in 1898 he published a very successful book entitled "Painting and Decorating" that was reprinted many times, the last edition being printed in the 1960s!

In 1903 Walter was elected “Master” of the Northern Art Workers Guild, and he was also a Fellow of the British Society of Master Glass Painters.

Walter J Pearce was a noted member of the Arts & Crafts movement in the North of England and his personal style is firmly Art Nouveau, with classical romantic fabrics and organic flowing lines. The Art Nouveau style is evident in many of his windows and runs throughout his decorating text book.

Walter patented a method of fixing gold leaf behind glass and several churches have wall panels that use this technique. He also created mosaics using tiles cut to shapes rather than small tesserae.

In 1939 at the age of 83 Walter was still advertising, working from a studio in Wilmslow, Cheshire. He died aged 86 in 1942 near Congleton in Cheshire, survived by his wife Annie. He had come a very long way from being an orphan to a successful businessman and respected artist.



This remarkable example of Walter J Pearce’s work was created for Stockport Sunday School. It is now in Stockport Museum. The theme is the resurrection and the outer panels show classical romantic angels with beautifully detailed wings awaiting Christ with the trappings of victory. The central panel is of Easter morning when the women arrive at the tomb to find the stone moved and an angel proclaiming the risen Christ.

After a really cold start, 2026 then warmed up for a while but seems to be back to what we might expect for the time of year.

Technically February is the last month of winter but may show enough signs of spring to get us all excited. The daffodils will be growing and primroses and crocuses may well be in flower. Catkins will be out and the Blackthorn will soon be blooming but it all depends on the weather.

Nature (without the benefit of the Met Office's long-term forecast) has to adjust every bit as much as we do and for some birds timing is crucial for nesting opportunities. They need to be confident that the food supply will be there for the young. Early nesters will be active during the month and you may have seen signs of Woodpigeons, Moorhens, Herons and Tawny Owls making plans for the next brood. The long cold spell in January brought many more birds to my feeders than usual and If you too have been helping our feathered friends I hope you added a count to the RSPB's Big Garden Birdwatch – a really good piece of Citizen Science at work.

Regardless of the weather the Badgers will be tucked-up in their dens and giving birth about now and if you're lucky Hares can be seen boxing in the fields. In a warm(er) spell Squirrels will stir themselves too. Lots to look out for (and record on our Wild Weedon website) as we head towards Spring. In the meantime stay warm folks.




