Dear Friends,

The decorations have been stored away; relatives have departed for home, and the last of the turkey is hopefully no longer lingering somewhere at the back of the fridge. Christmas has come to an end, the return to work/school has happened, and something of normality has resumed. January has dawned and the bleakness of the winter months continues as we all eagerly await the signs of spring.

Life seems to be full of periods of waiting for impending big events, like weddings and holidays. Sometimes we're just looking for signs that things are getting better, more hopeful, that something new and exciting will give added lustre to life. As a nation we have an international reputation for being experts at queuing, a people of patient endurance, willing to wait in line until our turn comes. Even within the Church, our seasons of preparation - like Advent and Lent - ask people of faith to await great festivals. The key question for us is how effectively do we use these times of waiting that are an inevitable part of life?

Once Christmas has passed the Church, traditionally, uses this period to remind itself of some of the key incidents in the life of Jesus. This then runs into Lent and a focus on the journey of our Lord towards Jerusalem, to crucifixion, and then Easter comes with the celebration of the victory of love through Resurrection. It is a time to ask the key question of who Jesus is.

Dictionaries in Stalinist Russia define Jesus as a mythical figure who never existed; others see him as the greatest human that has ever lived, whose message of peace and love still needs to be heard. The Church believes him to be the Son of God and the Saviour of Humanity, which are big, bold claims based on our understanding of the gospel story and the claims that Jesus and others made. One such book has, to my mind, a really impressive title: "The Man Who Chopped History in Half." It works on a number of levels ' most obviously it's designed to pique interest, to encourage potential readers to take the risk of picking it up to see what it is all about. Equally, it depicts something of what the author will endeavour to unfold as he seeks to explore the significance of Jesus, who came in response to prophecy and whose death, in Christian terms, offers a distant turning point of human history. Thirdly, it presents a challenge

to see whether the author can convince the reader to acknowledge the strength of his argument and agree with the title's assertion. Who is Jesus? It is a really profound question, showing how Christians can spend a lifetime evolving the understanding of who Jesus claims to be, and how this is important for us as we continue upon our pilgrimage of life. Ultimately, I would argue, it is a great love story not of a slushy romantic time, but a love story that speaks to all of us about the height and depth. the breadth and length. of the love that the God who brought us to be has for the whole of Humanity, and his desire that we might draw close and experience his compassion for ourselves. The story of Jesus is one that is real, gritty in places, as it contrasts something of a folly of humanity with the wisdom of the Divine. It invites the world to look anew at what it is to be human and invites us to seek to emulate the example that Jesus offered. Of love prepared to pay an ultimate price to allow us to share in love's victory and the belief that death is not an end, as there is the hope of eternal life for those who embrace the Jesus way.

I suppose the ultimate question here is whether this is the time for us to explore something more of the claims the Church makes about Jesus, in the hope of the we can discover a love that will never let us go.

Happy New Year. My resolution last year was to leave more wild, untidy spots in the garden to help wildlife and by and large I think it's worked. To help wildlife you too could:

- Make a woodpile with twigs and branches to provide shelter for all sorts of things (insects love this but so do hedgehogs).
- Provide water (especially when natural ponds freeze over).
- Add some bird feeders to help our feathered friends.
- Clear out your bird boxes and put up new ones. Some birds will use these to roost in over winter but they'll also be ready for the nesting season in spring.
- Keep it dark at night (minimise light overspill to help moths).
- Leave fallen fruit for wildlife to enjoy.
- Stay messy – a tidy garden is an empty garden!

Providing regular food and ice-free water will get your garden ready for the RSPB's Big Garden Birdwatch over the weekend of 23–25 Jan. This is a great excuse to do nothing for an hour except count the birds. Go to the RSPB's web page to register and submit your counts.

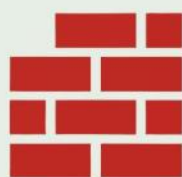
