Dear Friends.

By the time you read this the clocks will have gone back and the darker days of winter will soon be upon us. My wife is preparing for what, to her, are the wretched days of travelling to and from work in the dark - which add to that winter melancholy which can easily set in. For some this is a time to find space to travel in search of some winter sun while others immerse themselves in activity designed to beat the winter blues.

It is perhaps a time to reflect. For the Church this is symbolised by three important events.

Firstly, November begins with All Saints Day, a time to ponder the example that others have left us. Obviously, there is a spiritual connotation here as in church terms the idea is to look back and seek something of what it means to walk the Jesus way. I can recall folk who have lived through immense challenges and whose faith has helped them cope with disasters we would not wish on our worst enemies. In more secular terms it allows us to contemplate the question of what it is to live well, to fully embrace humanity, what it is not to live purely for self.

Secondly there is Remembrance-tide as the nation is invited to stop and remember those who have sacrificed so much so that we can enjoy the freedoms we do. It is a time to salute bravery and willingness to serve. It should encourage us to be thankful for all the men and women who set self aside and fought to protect those freedoms. Also, we need to be reminded that war and conflict, however just, always result in pain and sorrow as lives are lost or transformed because of the scars - both mental and physical - that conflict creates. The pain of the ordinary citizens of Gaza, the stories of hostages and their families as well as the mourning of loved ones lost should encourage us all to advocate for peace.

Finally, November will conclude with the beginning of Advent - a time when Christians prepare for the coming of Jesus. It speaks of hope and light, of promise fulfilled and how the coming child invites humanity to think anew. A time to reconsider the message of love that is at the heart of Christianity, God's love for us and to look at the child born to offer us salvation from our folly.

May these November days help us to appreciate more what it is to be human and how God speaks in love and invites us all to be advocates for true humanity.

Weedon Parish Council - Environmental Concerns

We are lucky to have great access to a large network of public footpaths in and around Weedon. It's important we can ALL enjoy them. Unfortunately, we must bring to your attention again that inconsiderate behaviour by a few is causing nuisance to the law-abiding majority.



DOG WASTE

Dog owners and walkers must keep all pavements, footpaths, verges, grazing fields and other public areas clear of dog excrement by bagging it and disposing of it appropriately. Dogs should be kept under control on public footpaths and roads – including routes across privately owned fields – so that owners can check if any dog mess needs clearing up.

Please pick up AND dispose responsibly. This is simple respect for other walkers, farmers and landowners, as well as being proper law-abiding behaviour. There are 3 dog waste bins in the village, which are emptied regularly, so you're never far from one: on Aston Abbotts Road at the Park and by the track leading to Kirby's Field (adj.no.56) and on lower High Street inside the Fortescue path gate.

Alternatively, take bags home for safe disposal (they can go in your general green-lidded waste bin). Please do not leave any littering the village or surrounding fields. If you see anyone allowing their dogs to foul our public spaces, please say something if you feel able to do so.

Weedon Parish Council - Play Area Consultation

The Parish Council is starting to review the play equipment in the Park, to consider timely replacements and additions over the next few years.



It's hard to believe that it was 10 years ago in 2015 that we celebrated the opening of the re-developed Play Area, following donations from local benefactors, a Parish Council grant and funding by WREN – the Waste Recovery and Environmental Services organisation.

Since then, the Parish Council has managed the Play Area, which is inspected annually by ROSPA, carrying out continuing repairs and maintenance to ensure that all the equipment is compliant and the

grounds are safe for all to use. We are fortunate that the items are still in good condition, but gradually some will need replacing and this is **YOUR** time to become involved.

The Parish Council has access to some limited funding which should allow for the upgrade or replacement of at least one or two pieces of equipment or provide something new.

Particularly if you are a regular user of the Play Area, please let us **HEAR YOUR VIEWS**. If you would like to be in a **working party** to help with the ideas, sourcing and viewing, then please contact Parish Council Chair Joanna Rose on <u>joanna@cjrose.net</u>. LEST WE FORGET



1914 - 1918

Private William George Abbey (57274) 4th Battalion, Worcestershire Regiment, died of wounds, aged 19, on 30th September 1918, Buried at Haringhe Military Cemetery, Poperinge, Belgium.

Private Lionel Edward Allen (766372) 1st/28th Battalion, London Regiment (Artists' Rifles), died of wounds, aged 34, on 2nd January 1918. Buried at British Cemetery, Manancourt, Somme, France.

Private Leonard Halsey (T242918) 7th Battalion, The Queen's (Royal West Surrey Regiment), killed in action, aged 30, on 23rd March 1918. No Known Grave but commemorated on a panel at Pozieres Memorial, Albert, France.

Corporal Charles Frederic Hopcraft (265759) 2nd/1st Bucks Battalion, Oxford and Bucks Light Infantry, killed in action, aged 19, on 26th April 1917. Buried in Chapelle British Cemetery Holnon, Aisne nr St.Quentin, France.

Private Leonard Williams Hughes (204775) 15th (Hampshire Yeomanry) Battalion, Hampshire Regiment, died of wounds, aged 24, on 23rd March 1918. Buried in Grevillers British Cemetery, Nr Bapaume, France.

Private Herbert William Jeffs (266164) 2nd/1st Bucks Battalion, Oxford and Bucks Light Infantry, killed in action, aged 19, on 22nd August 1917. No Known Grave but commemorated on panel at Tyne Cot Memorial, Passchendaele, Belgium.

Lance Corporal Charles Jones (9920) 1st Bucks Battalion, Oxford and Bucks Light Infantry, died of wounds, aged 20, on 8th April 1916. No Known Grave but commemorated in the Basra Memorial, Iraq.

Private Frederick Jones (9083) 2nd Bucks Battalion, Oxford and Bucks Light Infantry, killed in action, aged 26, on 11th September 1918. No Known Grave but commemorated on Vis-en-Artois Memorial, Arras, France

Private Herbert William Ming (15996) 1st Battalion, Grenadier Guards, killed in action, aged 21, on 13th March 1915. No Known Grave but commemorated on Le Touret Memorial, Bethune, Pas de Calais, France.

Private William George Ming (29980) 1st/8th Battalion, Royal Warwickshire Regiment, killed in action, aged 42, on 27th August 1917. No Known Grave but commemorated on Tyne Cot Memorial, Passchendaele, Belgium.

Private Herbert Owen Todd (53125) 18th Battalion, The King's (Liverpool Regiment), died from wounds, aged 37, on 20th July 1917. Buried in St. Mary's Churchyard, Hardwick, England.

Second Lieutenant Musgrave Cazenove Wroughton 12th (Prince of Wales's) Royal Lancers, died from wounds, aged 23, on 30th October 1914. Buried in Kemmel Churchyard, Kemmel, Belgium.

1939 - 45

Leading Aircraftman Pilot Douglas Thomas Foulger (655420) Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, died in accident, aged 20, on 7th October 1941. Buried in Weedon Chapel Churchyard.

Lieutenant Robert Thomas Edward Jacobs (324297) Gloucestershire Regiment, died in accident, on 10th February 1945. Buried in Venray War Cemetery, Holland.

Third Officer CHARLES BERNARD OLLIVER, B E M, Merchant Navy, S.S.Vancouver, killed when ship carrying Gasoline hit a mine, aged 47, 21st September 1941. Awarded B E M when a rigger on board H M Airship R33 in April 1925. Buried in St. Mary's Churchyard, Hardwick, England.



Wild Weedon

The Weedon Wildlife Group aims to protect and promote wildlife in and around Weedon and Hardwick



The trees have decided that autumn is here and there are conkers and acorns in abundance. Soon the winter visitors will start to fly in from Europe and of course there are lots of fungi to be seen.

The naming of fungi always brings a smile: Shaggy Inkcap, Twisted Deceiver, Weeping Widow, Dead Man's Fingers and Stinkhorn to list but a few. If you spot some while out walking why not post a photo on our facebook page. You could take things further still and submit recordings of the fungi you see to the national

database. For more information on how to do this look at https://www.britmycolsoc.org.uk/recording-fungi.html or the Bucks Fungus Group at https://www.bucksfungusgroup.org.uk/

Recording sightings of all things wild adds to the national view of the state of wildlife. Known as Citizen Science this sort of activity adds immense value and was the subject of our talk at the AGM last month. There are numerous ways of adding sightings or taking part in wildlife projects covering butterflies, moths, frogs, bats, birds and various mammals – in fact there seems to be an interest group for just about everything. So why not make a difference.

As Guy Fawkes night approaches it's worth making a plea to look out for hedgehogs already hiding under any bonfires you may be building. Many creatures use piles of leaves and sticks for overwintering in one form or another, so if tidying up the garden do leave an undisturbed area which will bring enormous benefit. Butterflies and moths too take advantage of those wilder patches to over-winter so being just a bit untidy is for once a good thing!

As the year comes to a close the must have item in your Christmas stocking is the Wild Weedon Calendar for 2026. Available from Mike Stevens or via any committee member this edition is a real celebration of the wildlife of our villages.

Match Report - Aylesbury Vale GC - Thursday 9 October 2025







Our seventh and final feature of the season was held at Aylesbury Vale GC for the Mike Moore Memorial Trophy; Mike was Treasurer for the Society for around 20 years up to his passing in March 2015.

Fourteen players took the took the field on a dry but gloomy autumn day and the only bright spot during the day was amazingly the quality of the golf with 11 of the 14 players scoring over 30 points in an individual Stableford competition for the trophy. The winner of the Mike Moore Memorial Trophy was Margaret Askew who lifted the trophy for the first time with an incredible 42 points; the results of the drugs test are still awaited! I was second with 40 points, with Adrian Bystra and Steve Exton (guest) in joint third place with 39 points.



FIREWORKS - TAKE UTMOST CARE

With Bonfire Night almost upon us, Weedon Parish Council would like to remind everyone of the duty of care when using fireworks – towards all of our neighbours, farmers, pet and horse owners. In a compact rural village location, it is more considerate to avoid small domestic displays.

Please think about your neighbours and their animals FIRST, if you want to let off fireworks in or on the edge of your village.

- The Fireworks Regulations 2004 do not allow fireworks between 11pm and 7am. On Bonfire Night, the cut-off is midnight.
- The Animal Welfare Act 2006 makes it an offence to cause unnecessary suffering to animals and is enforceable by the Police, Trading Standards or the RSPCA.

Breaking these laws can lead to on-the-spot fines, larger financial penalties or even imprisonment!

Fireworks and animals do not mix - inform neighbours well in advance

Livestock, horse and pet owners should be informed **well in advance** of any fireworks being released, so that they can take appropriate action to protect their animals from distress. Please consult with your neighbours and neighbouring animal owners if you intend to let off fireworks.

Information for owners wanting to protect their animals is available on the Blue Cross website: Fireworks and Animals.

The Fireworks Code

If you do feel that you want to use fireworks on any occasion, as a reminder of continued good practice, please read the short document on the Government website which is the ROSPA (Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents) Guide and which contains the Fireworks Code: ROSPA Guide.

Be aware of the danger of falling debris and always clear up afterwards

Please also remember that there is a danger in allowing the debris from fireworks to fall in built-up areas – particularly in Weedon and Hardwick where we have a number of thatched cottages. Debris can also cause significant harm to animals if they eat it or get caught in it. So be prepared to clear up wherever your used fireworks fall.
